The circus is one of the most popular forms of family entertainment because it is funny, scary and exciting. The lion-tamer puts his head into the lion's mouth. Acrobats perform daring tricks. The clowns make people laugh. There is something for everyone at the circus.

The first modern circus appeared around 1770, when a man called Philip Astley began to perform tricks on a horse. Astley, an ex-army officer, opened a riding school in London. In the morning he taught riding, and in the afternoon he performed tricks on his horse in a circular area which he called "circle" or "circus".

Astley's tricks became very popular and so he decided to make his "circle" bigger. He included acrobats, tightrope dancers, jugglers and a clown in the performance. It was a great success. More and more people came to see his show. In 1782, Astley opened Paris' first circus, the *Amphitheatre Anglois*.

Robin Williams is a famous American actor and comedian. He was born in Chicago, Illinois in 1952. His father was an executive with the Ford Motor Company and his mother was a model. His mother encouraged him to be creative, but Robin feels that he owes much of his success to his father. Robin's father taught him that he must make his own decisions in life and then go after his goals.



Robin studied political science at college and then studied acting at the prestigious arts school, Julliard. Interestingly, he initially trained to be a serious actor. While at Julliard, he helped pay for his tuition by working as a mime. After leaving Julliard, he went to California to perform stand-up comedy. In 1978, he got the lead role as a friendly space alien in the television series *Mork and Mindy*. Finally, he found his way into movies. His first films were *Popeye* and *The World According to Garp*.

Later, he began to act in more serious roles. He received nominations for an Academy Award for his roles in the films *Good Morning Vietnam*, *Dead Poets Society* and *The Fisher King*. He also made some very successful comedies including *Mrs Doubtfire* and *The Birdcage*.

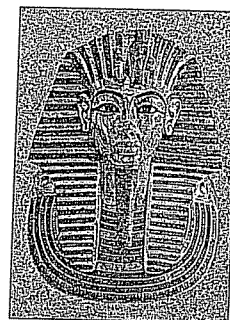

In ancient Egypt when Pharaohs died, the Egyptians buried them along with their treasures. To stop people from stealing the treasures, they put a curse on the tombs. The curse warned people not to open the tombs. No one dared enter the tombs for fear of the curse.



In the 1920s, an archaeologist named Howard Carter and his friend, Lord Carnarvon, were the first to enter the tomb of the Pharaoh Tutankhamen. A few months later, Lord Carnarvon became ill in Cairo and died. No one could determine the exact cause of death but it appeared to be an infection started from an insect bite on his face. According to legend, when he died, there was a power failure and all the lights in Cairo went out. At the same time, in England, his dog died. Even more peculiar was that three years later when Carter examined the Pharaoh's face, he found a similar mark to the one that Lord Carnarvon had. By 1929, eleven people connected with the discovery of the tomb were dead because of unnatural causes. During the second half of the 20th century the death toll continued to rise. In 1969, a survivor of the tomb expedition ridiculed the curse. Twenty-four hours later, his wife died.

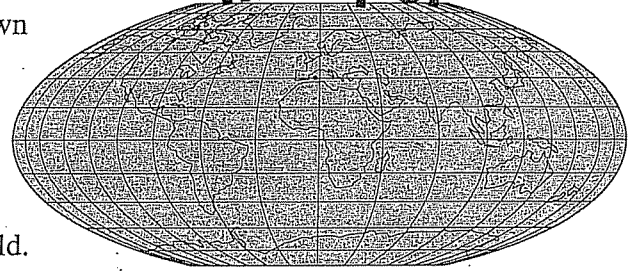

Every country in the world has got its own police force. The police are responsible for detecting and preventing crime in their own country. But what happens if the criminal escapes to another country? Then the police need help from an organisation called Interpol.

### Interpol



Interpol, the International Criminal Police Organisation, is the second largest international organisation in the world. It was established in 1923 to encourage cooperation between the police forces in different countries. Interpol cannot become involved in any political or religious activity. It can only deal with international crime within its member countries. There are 179 member countries in Interpol and they all finance the organisation.

Interpol works 24 hours a day in four languages: English, French, Spanish and Arabic. It collects and analyses information and shares this information with its member countries. For example, if the police in England need information about an escaped criminal, they can turn to Interpol for help. The organisation checks if the criminal appears in their records. They then send out the relevant information to all their member countries. If someone sees the criminal in France, they can report the information to the British police. In 2001, Interpol located 1,400 people.
